haiti relief

he world we know, the world we have created, is a complex place where we bear witness to the greatest joys and wonders, and where, too, we bear witness to deep sorrow and suffering. Sometimes the "miraculous" is directly received, and sometimes the tragic, too, befalls us directly.

When something happens "over there" or to "those folks" instead of "us," we know through the teachings of Spiritualism that it has also happened here in a vibrational sense. We cannot speak of being interconnected and then not recognize that whatever happens to others affects us at that most profound level, that of the spirit. Spirit does not make the distinctions of nationality, ethnicity, religious affiliation, or other means of categorization that define and promote separateness among human kind.

We are taught in Spiritualism, through our sixth principle the Golden Rule, to act toward others in a way that we would want others to act toward us. Life provides us ample opportunities to live by the Golden Rule and to do our part to co-create with God a better, kinder, more loving world. Some of us are given the opportunity to do so in very private and personal ways, such as when an animal in need happens onto our doorstep or a neighbor takes ill and needs assistance. Sometimes, there is a larger, "global" event to give us the opportunity to practice the Golden Rule. There is a traditional prayer/hymn that I paraphrase wherein the Infinite tells us: "That which you do unto others is that which you do unto me." It is another way of framing the sixth principle of Spiritualism. In a spiritual sense, we are our brother's and sister's keeper (and that of the earth and all creatures).

Though we may not be able to provide relief, assistance, or safe haven to every situation or every person, our life experiences and world events provide us with a myriad of opportunities to do our part within our means.

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

charity & clarity

his issue of the newsletter starts with an article about the philosophy of charitable giving in response to the critical situation in Haiti. In the past, the National Spiritualist Association of Churches (NSAC) has been the central collecting organization for Spiritualists interested in making donations toward relief efforts for major catastrophes. In a letter from the NSAC, local churches were encouraged to do this directly in order to provide a faster means of moving donations toward the intended recipients. Charity allows us to act on behalf of the Divine Expression, Infinite Intelligence, by being the answer to someone's desperate prayers. As Spiritualists, the act of charity allows us to more fully explore and express several of our Principles (see the column at right).

The larger focus of this issue, however, is on clarity: clarity of new processes and opportunities. In this issue of the newsletter, the new church board members are introduced. In addition, the president's report outlines new opportunities for members' voices to be heard, and both the Guild president and the President's Report offer avenues for members and friends of the church to have meaningful participation.

Last, but not least, are several workshops to also help us gain clarity. The first, being offered on February 21 with the Rev. John Sullivan, NST is on church management. For those members and nonmembers who are curious and want to understand more fully the roles of leadership in nonprofit, and specifically church organizations, then this is the workshop for you! Members of the church can attend for free. We are requesting a \$5 donation of nonmember congregants of our church and \$15 from the general public or those from other churches.

The second workshop will be on March 6 with British medium Pat Campbell. This workshop is for everyone, though geared toward the person who is just beginning their interest and activity for mediumship development. See the enclosed flyer for details.

In these times where the world moves so fast, world events enter our living room through the television and our computers within moments of their happening, it is helpful to rely on the philosophy of Spiritualism to maintain our perspective. In so doing, we can keep balanced and yet not lose our very human inclination to be charitable. In other words, we can live with both charity and clarity through (to emulate Charles Dickens), the best of times and, especially, the worst of times.

Ghandi said, "Be the change that you desire in the world." I offer this as a unifying perspective for the board and the members and friends of the church to adopt for the duration of 2010.






